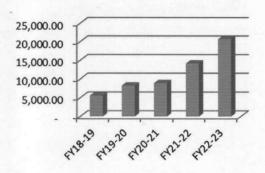

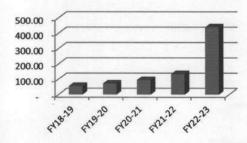

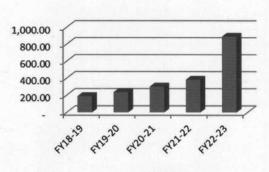
TOTAL INCOME - RS. IN LACS



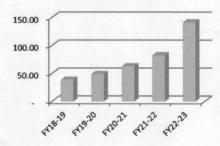
PAT - RS. IN LACS



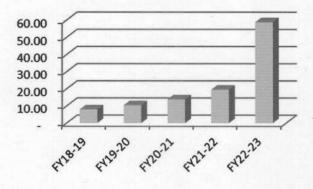
EBITDA - RS. IN LACS

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Shreenath Paper Products Private Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2023, and the Statement of Profit and Loss and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ('Act') in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2023, its **Profit** and cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the standards on auditing specified under section 143 (10) of the Companies Act, 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the code of ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements under the provisions of the Act and the rules thereunder, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the code of ethics.

The company got converted into a public limited company from private limited company on 20th April, 2023 i.e. after the date of the Balance Sheet. The provisions relating to a public company are applicable to the company for the FY2023-24 and hence, the compliance of such provisions are not being commented upon in this audit report for FY2022-23.

Management's responsibility for the financial statements

The Company's board of directors are responsible for the matters stated in section 134(5) of the Act with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the accounting standards specified under section 133 of the Act. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statement that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

II- SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Shreenath Paper Products Pvt Ltd)('the company') was incorporated on 10.10.2011 under the erstwhile Indian Companies Act, 1956 as a private limited company, having its registered address at Shop No. 5, Plot No. 136, N-1, Masco Corner, API Road, CIDCO, Chh. Sambhajinagar (Aurangabad) 431003 MS. The company is engaged in the business of acting as a Supply Chain Management company for printing paper industry, trading of various varieties of printing papers, chemicals and other allied products. Though the company was incorporated as a private limited company, the status of the company has been changed to Public Limited Company w.e.f. 21.04.2023.

2. METHOD OF ACCOUNTING AND BASIS FOR PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS:

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India under the Historical Cost Convention on accrual basis. These financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material aspects with the accounting standards notified under the section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read together with rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (Indian GAAP).

Accounting policies not specifically referred to otherwise are consistent with the generally accepted accounting principles followed by the company. All income and expenditure having a material bearing on the financial statements are recognized on accrual basis except in case of significant uncertainties.

All assets and liabilities, other than deferred tax assets and liabilities, have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are classified as non-current assets and liabilities. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets and their realization in cash and cash equivalents, the company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current pon current classification of assets and liabilities.

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3. VALUATION OF INVENTORIES:

Inventories are valued at lower of Cost or Net Realizable Value after providing for obsolescence and other losses, where considered necessary. Cost includes all charges in bringing the goods to the point of sale, including freight and other levies and receiving charges. The company has specifically valued the inventories of Traded Goods of all varieties of Paper and Ink at Lower of Cost or Market Price.

4. CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS:

Cash comprises cash on hand. Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value and balances in Current Accounts with Banks.

5. PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT:

a) Tangible Assets:

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost of acquisition or construction (inclusive of incidental expenses like freight, duties, taxes etc.) plus the operative expenses loaded on to the fixed assets proportionately less depreciation.

Land and Site Development are valued at Cost. The cost of fixed assets includes interest on borrowings attributable to acquisition of qualifying fixed assets up to the date the asset is ready for its intended use and other incidental expenses incurred up to that date. Subsequent expenditure relating to fixed assets is capitalized only if such expenditure results in an increase in the future benefits from such asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance.

Tangible assets are eliminated from the financial statements on disposal or when no further benefit is expected from its use and disposal. Gains/losses arising from disposal of fixed assets carried at cost are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

b) Intangible Assets:

Intangible Assets are stated at cost of acquisition (inclusive of incidental expenses like duties & taxes of which credit is not availed, interest prior to usage etc.)

6. DEPRECIATION AND AMORTISATION

a) Tangible Assets:

Depreciation has been provided on Written Down Value Method at the Rates as prescribed in the manner in the Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciation has been charged from the date of the assets brought into use and till the assets are disposed off on pro-rata basis after considering for their residual value.

b) Intangible Assets:

Software costs are amortised on WDV method over a period of 3 years as per the best estimate of the management.

7. PROVISION FOR CURRENT AND DEFERRED TAX:

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961. Provision for Current Taxes is made on the Computed Profit under the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Deferred tax is recognized on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantially enacted as at the reporting date. Deterred tax assets are recognized for timing differences of other items only to the extern that provides and the tax particular future.

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taxable income will be available against which these can be realized. For the year 2018-19, the company has recognized Deferred Tax Liability in the books for the timing differences between the depreciation as per the Books and as per the tax laws.

8. REVENUE RECOGNITION:

Sale of goods

Sales are recognized, net of returns and trade discounts, on transfer of all the significant risks and rewards of ownership to the buyer, which generally coincides with the delivery of goods to customers with no significant uncertainty regarding the amount of consideration that will be derived from the sale of the goods.

Sales exclude Goods and Service Tax. Rate differences collected on sales are not included in the value of sales. Similarly, the discounts and rebates allowed on account of rate differences, quality and quantity differences are not netted off from the figure of sales.

The Company recognizes all income and expenditure items having a material bearing on the financial statements on accrual basis only.

9. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS:

There are no foreign currencies transactions during the year.

10. LEASES:

The Company has taken the Shops and Godownson lease. Such lease is treated as operating lease. Under an operating lease, the lease rentals are to be recognized in the Statement of Profit & Loss.

11. BORROWING COSTS

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition of assets have been capitalized and other borrowing costs have been treated as expenses during the period in which they have been incurred.

12. PROVISION AND CONTINGENCIES

A provision is recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the Balance Sheet date and are not discounted to its present value.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed when there is a possible obligation arising from past events, the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the company or a present obligation that arises from past events where it is either not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle or a reliable estimate of the amount cannot be made.
